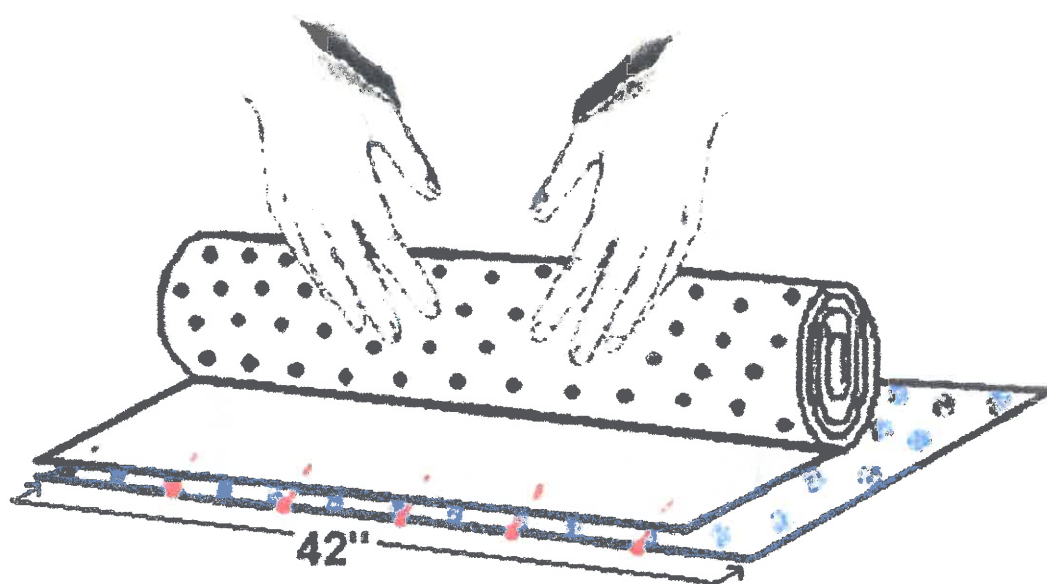


Hot Dog PillowCase (standard pillow size)

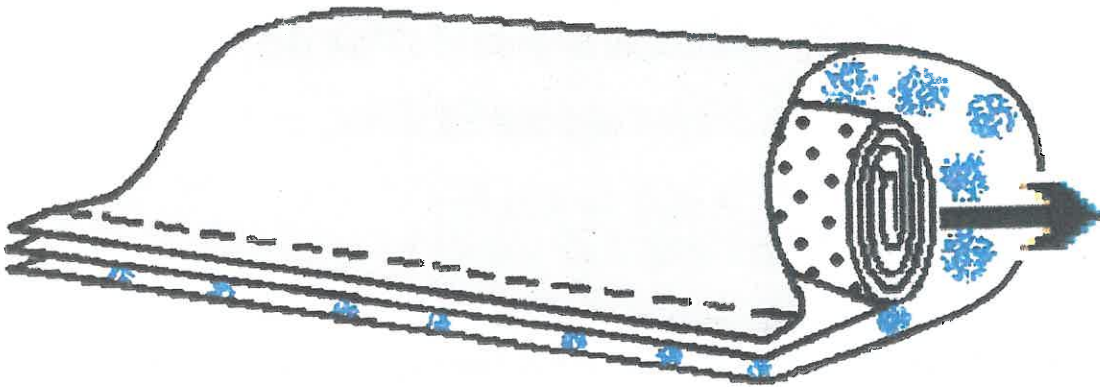
For each pillowcase you will need two **coordinating** fabrics

- a cuff fabric – 9" x width of fabric (at least 42")
 - a pillow fabric 27" x width of fabric (at least 42")
1. Trim both pieces to 42" wide.
 2. The cuff fabric is the "bun". Place it **right side up** on a flat surface.
 3. Lay one edge of the pillowcase fabric on top of the "bun", with right sides together. Pin all the raw edges together – a pin every 3" to 4" is good.

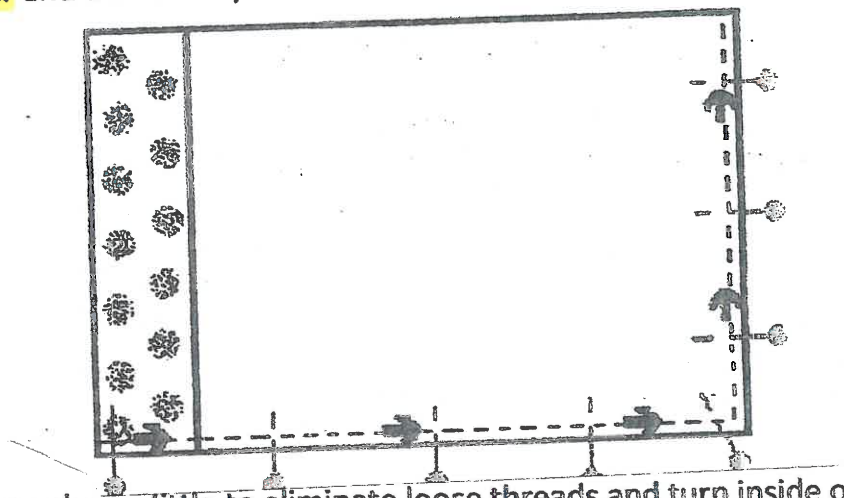


4. Roll up the pillowcase body fabric – forming the "wiener". Pin the "wiener" in place. The pins should be close enough to the edges so that you can remove them easily.
5. Wrap the other edge of the cuff fabric around the "wiener" and pin with all the raw edges together. Sew along the pinned edge removing pins as you get to them. Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " or wider seam allowance – be consistent.

6. Pull the "wiener" out of the "bun".



7. **PRESS** the seam flat on the wrong side and again on the right side, being sure the seams are **pressed to the stitch line**. Fold in half – **wrong sides together** and trim evenly if needed. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on the open side and top.



8. Trim raw edges a little to eliminate loose threads and turn inside out. Use something pointy (a knitting needle or chopstick works well) to bring out the corners and define the seam edges. **PRESS**.

9. Sew a $\frac{3}{8}$ " – $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam along the **seamed edges** to create a French Seam (all raw edges will be encased). Turn right side out. You're done!
