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## **WORKSHOP: RUFFLED ROSES AND FOLDED LEAVES**

Judith Hollenberger

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Participants will make a series of ruffled roses, kimono fold leaves, overlapped leaves, and buds. There will be time to arrange the flowers and leaves into a motif to apply to a garment, hat, or accessory, or create earrings, pins, or hairpins.

KIT is available at class for **\$25** payable to instructor. Kit includes everything listed below.

*If you want to bring your own materials instead of purchasing the kit, here's what you will need:*

### **Materials:**

- 6 yards 1" wide ribbon for roses (enough for 6 roses) – rayon, acetate, or silk preferred. Polyester ribbon can work if not stiff. Wired ribbon is especially suitable these types of ribbon flowers but not required.
- If making earrings - 1 yard of 1/2" wide ribbon is suggested for 2 earrings
- 2-3 yards ribbon for leaves and bud calyxes - rayon, acetate, silk, grosgrain, or petersham are all appropriate if not stiff. Wired ribbon can be used.
- 1 - 1 yard lightweight crinoline
- Basic hand sewing kit – needles, thread, pins, ruler or measuring tape,
- Scissors that can be used for ribbon
- Fray check (optional if you want to treat your ribbon edges)
- Pencil, Pen, and/or Marking tool such as fabric pen or chalk

- If making jewelry: earring parts, tie tacks, stickpins, etc.
- Fabric-tac fabric adhesive
- Felt, wool, or other scrap fabric for backing finished pieces

**Recommended Products: (these are not required, just tools that I like to use)**

- John James Long Darners #7 and #9 needles
- African Porcupine Quills ~7" - available from the Bone Room in Berkeley CA
- Coats Extra Strong nylon upholstery thread
- Coats Hand Quilting Thread
- Coats Jeans and Top Stitching thread
